



## Enabling Environment and Social Infrastructure

How do we give women and gender-diverse people the best chance at security and safety?

By improving economic security and ensuring equitable access to public services and social infrastructure.

By putting the needs of the most marginalized at the centre while ensuring access for everyone.

This pillar is about cultivating social and economic policies that help eliminate systemic barriers to gender equality and economic justice.

We recommend **21 immediate, short, medium, and long-term policy actions** for federal, provincial/territorial, and municipal governments that will lead to:

- ★ Improved income security
- ★ Better and safer work
- ★ Affordable housing and childcare
- ★ Accessible transportation and digital infrastructure
- ★ Equitable healthcare

At the heart of social infrastructure are universal basic services.

Keeping them public is critical to creating a Canada free of gender-based violence through the NAP.
