

What if a policy theme doesn't fit into just one of the four pillars?



Some themes call for different policy actions from different angles, depending on the process and outcomes they require.


For example, we have to take **different factors** into account when ensuring women and gender-diverse people have access to adequate income support and housing

Another example: How to **reduce** police and state violence, colonialism, and racism is different than how to **redress** the harms they cause.

Other themes that span across all pillars include:

- ★ human rights legal norms and protections
- ★ state and international obligations
- ★ harmonizing with policy responses to MMIWG
- ★ safe workplaces
- ★ healthcare
- ★ public transportation and transit
- ★ income support



Since violence against women and gender-diverse people is inextricably linked to other factors that affect their lives—aka intersectionality—public policy within the NAP must be intersectional itself.
